GENERAL BUSINESS.

CCQ By Law Changes

Changes to the By Laws as distributed to Clubs were accepted by the meeting. However, there was discussion on the term "temporary members" as mentioned in By-Law 3. Rodney Black (Family Club) reminded the meeting that, when setting their By Laws, Clubs need to be sure that their By Laws do not contradict their Model Rules.

LEOD Collection

Bob Barnett reported that the website has been updated with the current figures and that the majority of clubs are entering their LEOD figures on to the database. Some problems were being experienced with Apple Devices.

NATIONAL RALLY 2031 IN QUEENSLAND

Even though an official invitation has not yet been received from the NACC for Queensland to host the 2031 National Rally, it was pointed out that the need to choose a venue and a start-up committee is becoming more necessary as time slips by. It was also mentioned that the start-up committee does not need to be the committee who continues on to organising the Rally.

OTHER BUSINESS

The President informed the meeting that plastic disc bowls will be used at the 2025 National Rally in Mudgee, NSW. However, Queensland will continue to use the wooden discs at their State Rallies.
